Garden visits:

Our first visit will be on **22 March** to Coochie Mudlo Island in Moreton Bay to look at gardens and have lunch. More details will follow.

Landscapes at risk:

As you will be aware from reading the AGHS journal, the Society advocates for the protection of significant historic gardens and cultural landscapes. Your local branch was successful in saving two tall Bunya trees planted in 1870 near the former town hall in Toowoomba now adjacent to the Catholic Church and threatened by a car yard; other wins have been with the addition to the Queensland Heritage Register of the original designed landscaping of the Queensland Art Gallery and of Laurel Bank Park at Toowoomba.

Our 2013 survey of Historic Gardens of Queensland identified a short list of 224 places of significance so we have plenty to watch over. For example, the Save Victoria Park Inc has been fighting plans for a stadium in the park in the heart of Brisbane so as to maximise trees and green space. Please keep an eye open for developments that might affect significant gardens, parks and treed places in your neighbourhood. Together we may be able to assist in their protection.
